Things to Do in Appomattox

If you're a history lover, Appomattox is a must-visit destination. The Appomattox Court House National Historical Park is the site where Robert E. Lee surrendered to Ulysses S. Grant, ending the Civil War in 1865. You can also visit the McLean House, where the terms of the surrender were signed, and the Clover Hill Tavern, which served as a gathering place for soldiers during the war. Immerse yourself in the rich history of Appomattox by joining a park ranger-led guided walk and exploring the historic buildings and sites that make up the village.

Appomattox Court House National Historical Park
