There are several things to do in Appomattox. It is a Historical area. That is why I arranged for two extra nights at that price at the hotel in case you would like to come and explore the area.

## Things to Do in Appomattox

If you're a history lover, Appomattox is a must-visit destination. The Appomattox Court House National Historical Park is the site where Robert E. Lee surrendered to Ulysses S. Grant, ending the Civil War in 1865. You can also visit the McLean House, where the terms of the surrender were signed, and the Clover Hill Tavern, which served as a gathering place for soldiers during the war. Immerse yourself in the rich history of Appomattox by joining a park ranger-led guided walk and exploring the historic buildings and sites that make up the village.

### **Appomattox Court House National Historical Park**

You can't visit Appomattox without stopping by the Appomattox Court House National Historical Park. This park is home to the original courthouse where General Robert E. Lee surrendered to General Ulysses S. Grant, effectively ending the Civil War. Take a tour of the park and see the historic buildings, including the McLean House where the surrender took place. You'll also get to see the general store, which sells Civil War era clothing, uniforms, weapons, and flags.

### **American Civil War Museum**

The American Civil War Museum is another must-visit destination for history lovers. The museum features exhibits that showcase the southern Civil War history, including Lee's sword and other artifacts from the war. You'll also get to see Civil War era clothing and learn about the lives of soldiers during the war.

### **Clover Hill Village**
